Modelling the Multilingual Lexicon and Interlanguage Transfer

The purposes of this study are to introduce and discuss the multilingual mental lexicon models and the argument concerning the notion of dynamic nature of multilingual language storing and processing. The models of Levelt (1993) and De Bot (2008) are included in the discussion, followed by a dynamic view of multilingualism proposed in the dynamic model of multilingualism (Herdina & Jessner, 2002). The issue of language transfer in the development of third-language (L3) learning is also identified and described in the present work at different related levels of language processing as the nature of the multilingual mental lexicon.



The Integrated Waste Management and Sustainable Landfilling

Keywords: Sanitary Landfills, Sustainable and Integrated Solid Waste Management, Leachate Stabilisation Ponds, Lagos, Nigeria and Sub-Saharan Africa, Developing Economy

Waste management, being one of the most important aspects of urban development, is gaining importance among developing nations. Landfills, which were initiated for hazardous waste management and subsequently transformed into sanitary landfills, have been the most widely adapted practice for municipal solid waste management worldwide. The research were conducted over a 9 months period in 3 years on the operational strategy of the larger of the only two sanitary landfills and leachate treatment ponds in NIGERIA and sub-Sahara Africa. The purpose was to examine and evaluate the sanitary landfill and leachate stabilisation ponds against the backdrop of technically sound and sustainable management options. However, the conventional design of landfills not only fails to fulfill the needs of waste management but also fails to target optimal resource recovery and energy generation. In the present study, modified design was proposed for partially engineered landfill system based on theoretical considerations based on integrated and sustainable principles that can deliver environmental, social and economic stability in the nation. Furthermore, It was found that the system with modified design could yield 2.157 million tons of landfill gas (2.145 million tons of coal equivalent) out of one year of solid waste. Further, this could recover resource valued at US\$16.49 million per year.

Anti-ballistic Performance of a Unidirectional Basalt Fabric Laminate System

Contemporary military and other law enforcement operations are technology-driven with weapons and ammunition that demand a flexible, damage- and moisture-resistant, and lightweight protective materials with superior energy absorbing capacity. Ballistic fabrics made from high performance synthetic fibers such as para-aramid and natural fibers including basalt, and composites utilizing these fabrics, are among the leading materials for armor systems. Basalt fibers, which are extracted from igneous volcanic rocks, are natural fibers with mechanical and thermo-physical properties that are generally comparable or superior to glass and other synthetic fibers at a lower cost. This gives basalt-based composites an edge over existing materials for potential application as anti-ballistic protective panels. The aim of the present study is to experimentally determine the V50 performance and penetration resistance of a unidirectional woven basalt fiber laminated epoxy system at three different combinations of ply orientations [0, 45 and 90 degrees at both CW and CCW directions] consisting of 48 layers of the woven fabric. The V50 performance test was conducted in accordance to the MIL-STD-662F standard using the Universal Test Gun model UZ-2002. The V50 ballistic velocity are computed based on a minimum of six shots including three complete penetrations and three partial penetrations. The optimum number of layers of the basalt fabric to sustain the reference penetration velocity of 367 m/s corresponding to threat level II of the NIJ Standard-0101.04 are calculated for the current test specimen for future development.



Alternative Current Losses of Au-doped YBCO superconductors

Keywords: Magnetization AC, Shielding Effect, Loss-Magnetic Field

Alternative Current (AC) susceptibility measurements is commonly used to investigate the magnetic shielding properties and magnetization AC losses of materials. In this work magnetization AC losses of Au doped YBCO superconductors are calculated from AC susceptibility measurements with materials which have different Au content. Magnetization AC losses were measured in different temperature values and different AC magnetic field amplitudes at 500 Hz. Magnetization AC Loss-temperature and magnetization AC Loss-magnetic field dependencies were examined. Also the shielding effect of Au doped YBCO superconductors were analyzed.
