

The Impact of Corporate Social Responsibility, Supply Chain CPAs, Industry Life Cycle and the Quality of Financial Statements Empirical Study of Taiwans Electronic Industry

This study examines the corporate social responsibility (CSR) performance of listed companies in Taiwan by looking at how companies meet their CSR obligations and by exploring how employing supply chain certified public accountants (CSRSCPAs) affects the quality of their earnings. This studys results show that the inclusion of different supply chain streams reveal that upstream CSRSCPA are more likely than middlestream and downstream CSRSCPAs to receive favorable reactions from market participants. This is an indication that market participants are impressed by the specific expertise and knowledge of these professionals. Furthermore, maturity companies are more likely than growing ones to receive favorable reactions from market participants when CSRSCPA are upstream.



Liquidity Operations During the Financial Crisis 2007/08: Evidence from the Relations Between Korean Won Onshore and Offshore Markets

This paper addresses the interrelation of onshore and offshore markets before and after South Koreas Central Bank or Bank of Korea (BOK) responded to the financial crisis of 2007/2008. During the financial crisis, Korea faced a liquidity crunch and leveraged their high level of reserves to conduct liquidity operations e.g. swap agreements in late 2008. To analyse how the reforms affected the mean and volatility spillover in between the spot and NDF markets, an extended GARCH model was used. The main findings of this paper are that prior to the financial crisis, the won spot market dominated the offshore market, which means that this lack of information flow benefited the BOK to independently form monetary policy, e.g. setting interest rate and exchange rate policy. This changed after South Korea addressed the wons liquidity crunch at the height of the crisis. Mean and volatility spillover between the markets has diminished and the pricing gap has narrowed, outcomes which hold to the efficient market hypothesis. In addition to the empirical results, this paper also underlines the significance of liquidity and robust capital requirements for central banks.



Characteristics of Learning Outcomes and Behavioral Changes in Virtual Reality (VR): Focused on Learning Motivation, Immersion, Public Self-Consciousness

Virtual reality connects virtual reality and reality, and is utilized for various purposes in terms of consumer and producers. In particular, there is a study focused on learning how to induce learners to change the behavior of students in the field of learning, especially in the field of learning, which is a positive effect on learning motivation, immersion, and performance. However, traditional studies have mainly used VR initialization devices, which require recent studies in the latest device situations as the HMD (wearable device) VR is enlarged. This study conducted experiments in HMD VR and Tablet PC learning environments to analyze differences in device characteristics according to this technological evolution. Experimental designs were selected for 20 students who were in the mid - 20s and early - 40s who had experience using tablet PC and HMD - based VR more than once. The method was conducted within the subject design method (within subject design) The Results showed that Immersion and learning motivation had a significant effect on learning outcomes, but Public self - consciousness did not have a Moderate effect on Immersion, learning outcomes, learning motivation and learning outcomes. The Levene test result showed a significance level of 0.05 or more, and the significance of the t-value of the equally divided assumptions was found to be less than 0.05 in each construct. Therefore, Immersion, Public Self-Consciousness, Learning Motivation Is more positive than Tablet PC.

Experts estimate that the increasing number of global population will reach nine billion by 2050. Regarding this issue, it is no doubt that the humankind needs alternative energy, workforce, and most importantly, food source. UN Food and Agriculture Organization (FAO) presented the model of insect farming as a plausible yet definite solution for this problem. However, as I read through their analysis they only covered the surface of the insect farming not describing any microscopic information which made me to write this paper. This paper mainly focuses on the potential and challenges of insect farming and how this can contribute to Korean food supply. The global trend and the prospects will be elaborated through numbers and graphs. The benefits will be suggested through four steps analysis, backed up by real-life examples. The challenges will be introduced with two perspectives divided globally and domestically. Finally, the connections of distinguished attribute of Korea and insect farming will show how effectively it can support Korean food supply.



Financial Regulation as moderating, Influence of Corporate Governance, Institutional Quality, Human Capital and Firm Size on Financial Institutions Performance in Kenya

Keywords: InsecCorporate Governance, Institutional Quality, Financial Performance, Human Capital, Financial Regulation & Firm Size.

This paper provides new evidence that sheds light on the influence of corporate governance, institutional quality, human capital and firm size on financial institutions performance in Kenya based on sampled data from 236 financial institutions during 2006-2012. Also, this research is to find out whether the financial regulations could moderate the relationship among the influence of corporate governance, institutional quality, human capital and firm size on financial institutions performance in Kenya. Stratified sampling was adopted to obtain samples from the heterogeneous financial services sector. Primary data was collected through self-administered questionnaires to the managers of the various financial institutions. Analysis of data was conducted using Analysis of Variance (ANOVA), Multiple Regression and Correlation Analyses. A multivariate functional relationship expressed the relationship. The study aimed at assisting academics and policy makers craft policies that could promote financial sector development in Kenya considering the projected contribution the sector is poised to make towards economic growth as envisioned in vision 2030. The data analysis results demonstrated that corporate governance, institutional quality, human capital and firm size are statistically significant determinants of financial sector performance in Kenya.

Effect of Magnetic Abrasive Finishing on Surface of Microscale-Diameter Wire Material using Assistance of a Rotating Magnetic Field

Keywords: Magnetic Abrasive Finishing, Microscale-Diameter Wire Material, Rotating Magnetic Field, Unbonded Magnetic Abrasive Type, Surface Roughness, Removed Diameter.

This paper proposes a new magnetic abrasive finishing process of microscale-diameter wire material which it is considered difficult to achieve by conventional finishing process. The processing method uses assistance of a rotating magnetic field system with unbonded magnetic abrasive type. This process is considered to be able to efciently adopt in nishing technique for producing the smooth surface and removing diameter of wire material. In this study, we describe the development of magnetic abrasive finishing technique of microscale-diameter wire material, and clarifying the effective of significant process parameter on improvement of surface roughness and removed diameter, namely rotational speed of magnetic field, vibrational frequency of wire workpiece, and unbonded magnetic abrasive grain size. The experimental results show that the surface roughness of wire material improved from 0.25m to 0.02m for 60sec at 800rpm of rotational speed. Also, in terms of removed diameter, the performance was excellent. As the result, it is successfully adopted a magnetic abrasive finishing of microscale-diameter wire material using assistance of a rotating magnetic field with unbonded magnetic abrasive type.
