A Conceptual Framework for Effective Learning Engagement Towards Interface Design of Teaching Aids Within Tertiary Education

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Keywords: Interface Design, Interactive Teaching Aids, Interaction with Interface, Interactive Courseware

Interactive teaching aids has replaced the role of lecturer on how lesson content is being delivered in the current tertiary learning environment. Consistently, this implementation gives the challenges in complex information delivery method within the tertiary learning environment. Therefore, in designing an effective teaching aid as a communication tool, it should be well designed and developed by the lecturer. Towards this, lecturers basically become as an interface designer in the development of these interactive teaching aids. As interface design performed as a medium that communicates between user and the computer system through effective principles and elements of design, this paper empirically discuss to what extent lecturers and tutors basically understand the role of interface design in designing their teaching aids. Further this paper extensively proposed a framework on how lecturers and tutors should understand the role of interface design in designing teaching aids for tertiary education level.

Conservation of the Built Heritages in Old City of Kabul

The purpose of the study was to observe the historical transformations of the settlements in the old city of Kabul that has taken place over the last few decades. Specifically, the study focused on the history of the transformations from both physical and social perspectives in 19 and 20 centuries. First, the old city of Kabul was proposed as a replacing area with public spaces, greenery, markets, and parks in three different master plans; first master plan in (1962), second in (1970) and the third was proposed in (1978). Secondly, after civil wars, which coincided between 1992-1996, the people again started construction of houses based on their self-modified-architectural planning and budget. As a result, low-income families built houses using local materials, while a high-income level group of owners utilized industrialized materials. A total of 322 new houses that were constructed after the wars were physically observed in the area which was then classified into traditional and modern types. As per the outcome of our observations, 62% of the houses were the traditional type and 38% were found to be of a modern type. According to the analysis, old city of Kabul has some opportunities for the conservation and regeneration of the cultural heritage among current active stakeholders. In this regard, community-based administrative key persons (locally known as Wakil Gozar), Mosques and high schools are among the most viable platforms through which this message can be delivered effectively. In a view to mitigating the on-going high rise building modernization, controlling of the area recommended by local municipality offices.
